SUMMER TAXES DUE SEPTEMBER 16, 2019

Summer taxes are due Monday, September 16, 2019. We will be open that day 8:00am - 5:00pm for tax collection only. We do not accept postmark for paying taxes. Payment must be at our office by the day it is due to avoid interest being added.

Clean-up day for the fall will be Saturday, October 19, 2019 from 8am to Noon.



IF YOU QUALIFY

You can defer your summer tax payment due September 16 to be due along with winter taxes on February 14, 2020 with no interest penalty. Forms are available at the township office.



From the Desk of Brandon Hughes, Fire Chief

Liberty Township Fire Department is a full service department, responding to all fires, vehicle accidents, medical emergencies and public assistance calls. The department is more prepared than ever before to handle these types of emergencies, and requests for service. The taxpayers of Liberty Township voted a millage into effect last fall to purchase a new fire engine. The 2019 Spartan pumper was placed into service in February, carrying six firefighters and a variety of state of the art equipment to service our residents. A new set of hydraulic extrication tools (Jaws of Life) were placed on the new engine when it arrived. The demands of the tools are rising as vehicle technology increases and metal strengths increase.

The department was able to sell our 1998 engine that was replaced this winter to a small community in rural Kentucky. With some of the revenue generated from the sale of the engine, a LUCAS III automated CPR device was ordered. This device straps on to the cardiac arrest patient and provides seamless and effective chest compressions at the recommended rates set by the American Heart Association. This device is state of the art technology and will provide the best clinical opportunity for the patient's survival. Liberty Fire Department, and its administration will strive to provide the best possible fire and medical service to our residents, as well as the thousands of visitors that pass through our community daily.
